

She did it, she said, because she felt drawn to the university and its values. "Brandeis was so different for its time," said Levin. "I felt that I wanted to do something for the university and what better than to support the library." We're so proud!

Dear Members of the Brandeis National Committee,

This is a message to let you know that the IRA Charitable Rollover Provision has just been extended to the end of 2011. That gives donors a special opportunity to support the University AND receive significant tax advantages at the same time. The provision, that was signed into law about 2 weeks ago, allows taxpayers 70 1/2 years of age and older to make direct, tax-free transfers to charities from a qualified individual retirement account (IRA). This new law also allows transfers made in January 2011 to be treated as if it was made in

2010, if the taxpayer chooses. It also provides favorable tax treatment retroactive to January 1, 2010 (before this new provision was enacted.) To take advantage of this unique offering, donors merely need to direct their IRA custodian to issue a check directly to Brandeis.
