Last year on the eve of Brandeis University's 70th birthday, its President, Ronald Liebowitz, launched, "A Framework for Our Future," a plan to reimagine and revitalize the university. Updating and digitalizing electronic access to these materials will help preserve the originals, invite new forms of digital scholarship and ensure global access to our valuable, one of a kind research collections. **Honoring Our History: Transforming Unique Collections Highlighting Social Justice is a 2 year, \$500,000 campaign.**

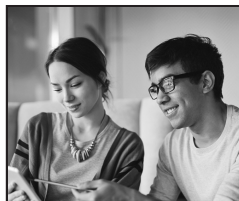

HOW IT ALL BEGAN

It was 2000 where at a lunchtime gathering of women from the Boca Raton Chapter of the Brandeis National Committee, someone suggested we put together literary luncheons to offer to our membership. The event would bring in various authors to speak about their literary works and entertain questions from our members. Our idea was to provide a forum for discussion, study, good food, and camaraderie among our diverse and impressive group of women.

At first, we weren't sure how to start. Did we need national authors? Did we have the resources to attract those authors? How many women would actually be interested? We decided to begin with a few local authors that we knew had written some mystery books. We found a small bookstore in Sunny Isles called Murder on the Beach. Jo-Anne Sunchuk owned the store. We called her and later drove down to meet with Jo-Anne. After our meeting, she agreed to help make our vision of this exciting luncheon series into a reality. Two weeks later, we booked the old Holiday Inn on ALA and, with Jo-Anne's help, were able to convince two local authors to attend our initial luncheon. These authors were Edna Buchanan and Barbara Parker. Sixty members attended that first luncheon and its success set the stage for what has become our Brandeis Book & Author Luncheons.

Over the last nineteen years, these luncheons have seen so many successful authors come to entertain and educate our membership and their guests. The events have grown dramatically and now often bring in hundreds of attendees.

Thru the years, these luncheons have also brought in enough money to contribute to so many worthwhile Brandeis causes. The building of a new library, scholarships to deserving students in need, the establishment of research rooms as well as providing new technology for research have all been supported by funds from these amazing events. In addition, we have been able to contribute to research efforts in the fields of Alzheimer's, Parkinson's, ALS, and autism which we all hope will someday provide us answers as to how the brain works and ultimately cures for these debilitating diseases of the brain.

Thank you to so many women that have generously given of their time, effort, and money to support these luncheons year after year. The success of this luncheon series is your success and could not have been realized without all of you.

We appreciate all of our attendees and guests for your continued support of BNC's mission each year.

Dear Members of the BNC Boca Raton Chapter,

I am endlessly thankful and appreciative to have been chosen as a recipient of the BNC Boca Raton Endowed Scholarship in Jewish 'Studies. I am unquantifiably grateful for your kindness and support.

It has been an incredibly packed year. My favorite highlights from last semester are that I served as the assistant to the Admissions Marketing Department at school, was the Executive Producer of one of our school plays, became a Brandeis Bridges Fellow (a group that seeks to bridge the gap between the Black and Jewish communities on the Brandeis campus), where I now serve as the Events Coordinator for the fellowship's Executive Board, and was a Cornerstone Fellow for the Foundation for Jewish Camp. This semester, in addition to five classes, I recently finished creating my own major program, Interpersonal and Mass Communication, which was reviewed and approved by a committee of high ranking Brandeis professors.

I am currently working two jobs. During the week I am an assistant to the Senior Vice President of the Division of Student Affairs, and on weekends I teach second grade Torah School at a local synagogue. Finally, in terms of extracurricular activities, I am a Mandel Fellow for Jewish Educators, the Junior Class Representative for the Brandeis Latinx Student Organization, and am the Merchandise Coordinator for my a-cappella group.

This year has taught me so much about prioritizing and managing my time and using my voice to effectively advocate for myself and others. It has also really shaped the direction I want to take my life after Brandeis. This summer, I hope to build my professional portfolio as a Communication or Human Resources intern at a Jewish non-profit in New York City. As of now, I am double-majoring in Interpersonal and Mass Communication and Near Eastern and Judaic Studies and am minoring in Social Justice and Social Policy. With these degrees, I intend to apply for a job in the Union for Reform Judaism after graduating and will soon after apply to Hebrew Union College with the intention of becoming ordained as a rabbi.

My family and I have really struggled financially to keep me at Brandeis. Thank you, from the bottom of my heart, for helping me through my college career. I am so grateful to be a part of the Brandeis community, and for everything that I have learned both personally and academically.

I am looking forward to making the most of the rest of my time here, and cannot wait to see what the future has in store.
